

#### One Load at a Time: The Akron Laundry Ministry

We are excited to highlight a successful new program at SVDP, the Laundry Ministry. Recently, our Sacred Heart of Jesus conference in Wadsworth started offering free laundry service to individuals in need. St. Augustine Parish in Barberton also has a laundry ministry and works closely with the SVDP conference. Holy Moments spoke with Tiffany Leonard from Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mike Moore from St. Augustine to learn more about this new ministry.



At Sacred Heart of Jesus, the financial benefit to those in need is meaningful. The cost of washing and drying clothing is more than most of us realize and having clean clothes makes us feel better and instills confidence. But one unexpected benefit was the fellowship and camaraderie that developed among the patrons. They help each other fold laundry, share ideas on stain removal, discuss what companies are hiring, play games, and share in each other's successes.

To get the word out, fliers were distributed to social service agencies in Wadsworth. People were informed of the program when they came to the Sacred Heart food pantry. Other churches were alerted, and the popularity of the free service continues to grow by word of mouth.



If you're looking to start a laundry ministry at your conference, Tiffany says, "It's been a great service if you want to meet this basic need in your community. Madeline Schwab leads this with me, and she has been able to secure grants to help fund it. I would advise others to look into that possibility. Team up with a laundromat who has a vested interest in the community. There are apps now that run the washers and dryers, so the process is easy once you get started."



If you know anyone that might need the Laundry Ministry in Wadsworth, available times include the 3rd and 4th Wednesdays each month from 6pm-8pm at College Street Laundromat.

In April, St. Augustine commemorated the 3rd anniversary of its Laundry Ministry. Ιt started was when Common Threads Closet, which has donated clothes, sheets, walkers, and wheelchairs to SVDP, suggested it. They were facing a problem with people routinely taking clothes and throwing them out, instead of washing them.

Mike Moore agrees there are many benefits, especially knowing that students can go to school no longer bullied about having dirty clothes. They have been told neighbors used to resort to washing their clothes in a nearby resevoir.

St. Augustine passes out fliers around the community and during food pantry hours. They too have received grants to help support the ministry and the elementary school donated a full year of laundry pods. Its congregation also donated \$20K to fund the program. SVDP conference members staff the laundromat during available hours. Our conferences in Wadsworth and Barberton are truly changing lives – one load at a time!

#### Faith, Fellowship, and 51 Years: Welcome Fr. Snedeker

Fr. Snedeker grew up in South Euclid, OH and attended St. Gregory the Great grade school. His family then moved to Independence where he graduated from Independence High School. He was ordained a priest in 1974 and first served at St. John Nepomucene in Cleveland.

From 1977-1988, Fr. Snedeker coordinated campus ministry at several colleges including Ashland University, College of Wooster, Wayne Technical College and the Agricultural Technical Institute. He next served at Baldwin Wallace College for 10 years while also becoming the Director of Campus Min-

Bishop Pilla assigned him as chaplain at Metro Health Hospital, where he served for 12 years. Fr. Snedeker loved his work as a chaplain imparting his Catholic charism in a hospital serving the poor. The work was humbling and rewarding. Fr. Snedeker's ministry at Metro, meeting the spiritual needs of the marginalized and forgotten, developing a personal relationship with the poor, aligns perfectly with the mission of SVDP.

> He retired in 2013 but still works part-time for Constellation Hospice Services. He continues to enjoy the ministry, taking time to get to know pa

tients and hear their stories. He added it is like St. Vincent de Paul to sit with the ordinary and be present with one another. His first patient opened up to him under the pretense that they would play chess as he did not believe in God. Although they never played, they routinely prayed together until the man's passing. He loves this work and reflects that Christ walked with dirty, dusty feet among the poor as they were, just like St. Vincent de Paul.

As Spiritual Advisor, Fr. Snedeker looks forward to engaging with members of SVDP and its leadership, offering spiritual guidance, while preparing meditations, and reflections.
